## **1. Performance Review : Shushrusha, Dadar**

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- 1.1 The Hospital has treated 53,024 patients during the current financial year, as compared to 60,878 patients treated in the previous year.
- 1.2 The effective bed occupancy on an average during the year under review was 100 per day. The present bed strength of the hospital is 127 beds.
- 1.3 The Hospital has earned a total income of Rs. 52,17,08,480/- on clinical services compared to the income of previous year Rs. 48,36,19,481/-, showing an increase of 8%.

## 1.7 Internal Audit

Statutory Auditors, M/s. S. K. Patodia & Associates, Chartered Accountants, had audited the Statement of Accounts for the FY 2016-17. The Registrar of Co-operative Societies has completed the Statutory Audit for the Financial Year 2012-13 and 2013-14.

We have Internal Audit Department to ensure and safeguard hospital assets, to prevent and detect of errors, and to guarantee accuracy and completeness of the accounting records.

## 1.8 Membership

- Equity Share Capital stands at Rs. 241.06 lakhs, registering an increase of 7.42% over the previous year.
- The number of members on the roll of Society has gone up to 21,953 showing an increase of 194 members.

## 1.9 Benefits to poor patients

Hospital offers free medical treatment to the indigent patients who are below poverty line and 50% subsidized medical treatment to the poor patients who are above poverty line. In addition hospital offers concession in medical bills to the patients who have financial constraints during their long illness.

- a) Benefit amounting to Rs. 7,06,791/- was given to free poor patients under the Below Poverty Line Scheme.

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- b) The benefit amounting to Rs. 20,93,708/- was given as treatment at half cost to patients who are "Above Poverty Line"
  - c) Free surgeries conducted on Eye Camp patients amounted to Rs. 16,50,023/-.
  - d) Dean's concessions were given amounting to Rs. 36,18,833/- to deserving patients.
  - e) The Hospital conducts free Cleft & lip Surgery under the "Smile Train Project". The Project is run in association with Indiabulls Foundation. During the year under review Hospital spent Rs. 6,37,711/- from its own account.

**A total amount of Rs. 87,07,066/- was spent to help poor patients.**

- f) Hospital has a unique Scheme of super-speciality Joint Replacement Surgery for last 3-4 years where the package deal offers to the patients is Rs. 75,000/- Rs. 80,000/-. This has benefitted crippled Arthritics from low income group to become ambulatory (mobile), free from pain and lead normal life. The number of surgeries done is 116.

## **2. Performance Review : Enhancing Patient Care**

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### **2.1 CENTRE FOR BRAIN & NERVOUS SYSTEM**

173 advanced Neuro Procedures were performed on patients requiring acute stroke thrombolysis, clot extraction in acute stroke etc.

### **2.2 CENTRE FOR CARDIAC CARE**

In continuation of our facility, the Management has consistently upgraded the department by bringing together resources, expertise and capabilities in Cardiology, Cardiothoracic, Vascular Surgery and Cardiac Rehabilitation. The number of Angiography done is 336 and angioplasty done is 116.

### **2.3 CENTRE FOR BONE AND JOINT REPLACEMENT**

The department is specialised in Total Hip/Knee Replacement, Deformity Correction & Limp Reconstruction, Slipped Disc Surgery in Neck or Lower Back, Cartilage Repair in Joints, Children Orthopedic Disorders, Arthrities Treatment and Complex Trauma Services.

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## 2.4 CENTRE FOR SPINAL SURGERY

The department offers Minimal Access and Endoscopic Spine Surgery besides routine procedures.

## 2.5 CENTRE FOR CRITICAL CARE

**Every life is precious and every second counts :**

The Department offers integrated multi-disciplinary services from the initial diagnosis to complete recovery via rehabilitation, thus offering the best possibility of survival to patients who are critically ill.

## 2.6 ACCREDITATION

ISO 9001:2008 certification was renewed twice for period of three years each in recognition of our Quality Health Care Services Management, confirming that our institute has been implementing stringent standards and guidelines laid by the accreditation authority.

We have worked on and have recently acquired NABH Safe-I for optimal infection control.

## 2.7 SPECIALITY CLINICS

### a) Nephrology clinic / Dialysis unit

The facility is one of most social oriented activity to keep patients suffering from kidney failure. This is one of the best units in city of Mumbai. Number of patients treated during the year was 266.

### b) Diabetic foot clinic

15 % of all diabetics will develop a serious foot problem and our Diabetic Foot Package provides preventive and treatment services under one roof.

In addition, if necessary, services of an Interventional Experts are available to open up blood vessels of diabetic patients.

Rehabilitation from diabetic foot-related problems, including total contact cast and appropriate footwear advice is also provided.

### c) Smile Train Project (Free Cleft Lip and Palate surgeries)

This project is part of our international collaborations and we continue to offer excellent

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services to poor children with congenital facial problems.

Surgery brings about a positive change in the personality of children affected by facial disorders. So far we have conducted more than 1600 operations of cleft lip, cleft palate and other related deformities, free of cost.

**d) Parkinson's Clinic (Free OPD) and other services**

We run special clinics for Parkinson's disease, Osteoporosis and Pain Management.

### **3. Performance Review : Vikhroli Hospital**

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773 children and 2027 women were treated in the OPD and 134 deliveries and 61 operations were performed during the year under review. The management has kept charges for various services as low as possible in spite of less returns as the Vikhroli Hospital is a pioneering effort of our Institution and caters to low income group, we look at this Unit as a service to the Society.

During the year hospital had organized medical camps on 'Thyroid Dysfunction Detection', Medical Check-up for children and adults was done to bring awareness among the public and take timely treatment against diseases normally prevalent in the community. Our doctors participated in the Awareness Programme 'Care of Health' in Ganeshotwava, 2016.

	During the year 33 blood donation camps were organized and over 1000 units of blood were collected from centres like Navneet Jain Health Centre, Dadar, Vikas College, Vikhroli and others.
	As per government initiative, "Skill Development Programme", Shushrusha provided exposure to General Duty Assistant (GDA) and Home Healthcare (HHC) through I-care Organisation since 03.11.15. More than 100 students have taken training in Skill and Grooming of staff.

4.2 Dilasa Kendra in Shushrusha – Dadar, organized monthly programmes for Senior Citizens on second Sunday of every month at OPD for the last 8 years. These include medical, financial and other relevant issues concerning elders.

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## 6. Consultants

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The management continues to have bonhomie, understanding and healthy relationship with its consultants. The consultants, on their part, have contributed to provide yeoman human care. The feedback from patients endorses this view. All feedback sheets state that the consultants are the best assets the hospital has.

The Board of Directors wishes to put on record and appreciate the active involvement, valuable support and co-operation offered by the Consultants. The management will ensure greater participation by Consultants, so that their valuable experience and services are available to a larger population.

## 7. Going forward – Vikhroli Hospital Project

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Diversification is a path towards progress & need for state-of-the-art care at the doorstep. We took up a challenge to build brand Shushrusha in Vikhroli. Vikhroli Maternity Home was a nucleus around which the idea of a well equipped hospital was thought of. It was indeed a need of the hour. It is noteworthy that medical facility available around Vikhroli was meagre. There was no hospital between Thane and Ghatkopar barring Godrej hospital which is basically a healthcare facility run by Industry in Vikhroli. Kannamwar Nagar between Bhandup and Mulund needed a well equipped state-of-the-art medical facility mainly to attend serious emergencies around the clock. It has taken us 47 years to fulfill our promise to citizens of Vikhroli. The day is near and the hospital will be inaugurated in very near future. This hospital will be a hallmark for the suburbs specially Kannamwar Nagar. The hospital will provide facilities like intensive, medical, cardiac, pediatric and neonatal care. The maternity home facilities will be continued. The hospital provides excellent OPD facilities with diagnosis in imaging like Radiology, Ultrasonography and C.T.Scan. The pathology department is well equipped to offer all the routine, special and advanced diagnostic tests around the clock. Five modern modular Operation Theatres are housed, three in main O.T block, one in Obstetrics Ward one in OPD. Even the General Wards have been designed and equipped with facilities that any patient will feel at home. The hospital design is made in such a way that there is adequate light and pleasant environment to ensure comfort and mental relaxation. With a aim to prevent death, disability and to ensure good clinical recovery the hospital provides total 42 beds for intensive care. To ensure complete recovery a well equipped physiotherapy department will be functional. The concept is total care under one roof. The reception area will house the facilities for registration and OPD counter. A small cafeteria will serve the citizen during their attendance in the hospital. Semi special and special rooms will be available for comfort of patients from upper

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middle and higher income group. A well equipped canteen with restaurant for patients and relatives and a separate unit for the doctors is added attraction. The modern kitchen will provide proper hygienic food and snacks to serve the community. The Emergency Medical Department located on ground floor will operate 24 hours with proper life saving drugs and other facilities. A modern drug store is located next to EMS and near OPD to ensure that the medicines are available to the patients quickly. Its upto citizens of Vikhroli and surrounding areas to take advantage of this facility, come forward and be a part of the hospital by being shareholders which is an unique concept in health care.

To fulfill this dream project, total commitment, hard work and special efforts which have been put in by Shri D. K. Afzulpurkar, the man who piloted the whole project need to be recognized. His colleagues like Mrs. Vaishali Dhote and Mr. N. K. Fovkar need to be complimented. The Board of Directors and Vikhroli Committee supported the project wholeheartedly. Credit must go to all the members, the donors Tulsiani family – Mrs Suman, Mr. Ramesh and Mr. Kuvelkar need special appreciation for their generous donation, but for the help of Saraswat Co-operative Bank who gave loan at a very reasonable rate helped us to fulfill our project. An institution is not built with bricks and mortar but by the will, commitment, perseverance and desire to serve the Community that such institutions are created. Shushrusha's Suman Ramesh Tulsiani Hospital, Vikhroli is a shining example of people's co-operative movement in healthcare. An institution of the people, by the people and for the people.

### (अ) नेफ्रोलॉजी क्लिनीक / डायलिसिस (मूत्रपिंड विकार उपचार व कृत्रिम मूत्रपिंड शुद्धीकरण उपचार विभाग)

समाजाभिमुख सुविधांमध्ये, मूत्रपिंड निकामी होण्यापासून रुग्णांना वाचविणाऱ्या या सेवेत, मुंबईतील सर्वोत्तम केंद्रांमधील एक आमचे केंद्र आहे. अहवाल वर्षात २६६ रुग्णांवर उपचार केले.

### (ब) डायबेटीक फुट क्लिनिक (मधुमेहग्रस्त पाय उपचार केंद्र)

एकूण मधुमेहग्रस्त रुग्णांपैकी १५ टक्के रुग्णांच्या पायाला कधीना कधी संसर्ग होतो आणि त्यामुळे रुग्णाला पाय किंवा जीव गमवावा लागतो. त्याविषयी प्रतिबंधात्मक व मधुमेह उपचार विषयक सर्व सेवा एकाच छताखाली येथे उपलब्ध आहेत.

तीव्र आणि दीर्घ स्वरूपाच्या मधुमेह आजारावर आपल्या हॉस्पिटलमध्ये उपचार करण्याकरिता प्रशिक्षित कर्मचारी वर्ग आणि अद्ययावत उपकरणे आहेत. मधुमेहग्रस्त रुग्णांच्या रक्तवाहिन्यांतील अडथळे दूर करण्याकरिता, इंटरव्हेंशनल एक्स्पर्ट्स् आपल्याकडे आहेत.

मधुमेहामुळे संसर्ग झालेल्या रुग्णांच्या पायाला भौतिकोपचार देऊन त्याचे पुनर्वसन करण्यात येते आणि अशा रुग्णांना योग्य प्रकारची पादत्राणे वापरण्याचा सल्ला दिला जातो.

### (क) स्माईल ट्रेन प्रोजेक्ट (स्माईल ट्रेनचा उपक्रम : दुभंगलेले ओठ व टाळू - मोफत शस्त्रक्रिया)

#### Report on the Financial Statements as a Statutory Auditor

1. We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Shushrusha Citizens' Co-Operative Hospital Limited ('the Hospital'), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2017 and Income and Expenditure for the year then ended, and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information incorporated in these financial statements of the Society.

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## SCHEDULE C

### NOTES ON ACCOUNTS FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31<sup>ST</sup> MARCH 2017

#### NATURE OF OPERATIONS:

The Hospital is engaged in providing medical and health care services to its members and citizens including below poverty line. It has been a success in following the model of citizen's participation in healthcare. It has performed well on a sustained basis for more than 40 years and has been able to provide state-of-the art medical and healthcare services to its members and citizens.

#### A. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES :

##### 1. ACCOUNTING CONVENTIONS :

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention, in accordance with Indian Generally Accepted Accounting Principles ("GAAP"), the accounting standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, as adopted consistently by the hospital. All income and expenditure having a material bearing on the financial statements are recognized on accrual basis.

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires that the management make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities as of the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from these estimates and difference between these actual results and estimates are recognised in the period in which these results are known / have materialized.

The accounting policies as discussed below are consistent with those used in the previous year.

##### 2. REVENUE RECOGNITION :

- Hospital Income:**  
Revenue from the hospital receipts is recognised once the transaction is posted to the patients' folio in the system.
- Donation:**  
The amount received on account of donations is recognised on receipt basis.
- Interest:**  
Revenue is recognised on a time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the rate applicable.
- Dividend Income:**  
Revenue is recognised when the shareholders right to receive payment is established by the Balance Sheet Date.
- Other Income:**  
Other Income is accounted on accrual basis as and when the right to receive arises.



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### 3. FIXED ASSETS, INTANGIBLE ASSETS AND WORK IN PROGRESS :

**Fixed Assets:**

Fixed assets are stated at cost, less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any. Cost comprises the purchase price and any cost attributable for bringing the asset to its present location and in working condition for its intended use. Fixed Assets below the amount of Rs. 5,000/- are fully depreciated during the year of purchase.

**Capital Work in Progress:**

Cost incurred for construction of the Vikhroli would be recognised as Capital WIP till the project is ready for operation.

### 4. DEPRECIATION :

Depreciation is provided using the 'Written Down Value Method' as per the rates and the manner prescribed in the Income Tax Act, 1961.

### 5. IMPAIRMENT OF ASSETS :

The hospital assesses at each balance sheet date whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. In case of such indication, the hospital estimates the recoverable amount of the asset. If such recoverable amount of the asset or the recoverable amount of the cash generating unit to which the asset belongs to is less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount is reduced to its recoverable amount.

The reduction is treated as an impairment loss and is recognised in the Profit and Loss Account. If at the Balance Sheet date there is an indication that if a previously assessed impairment loss no longer exists, the recoverable amount is reassessed and the asset is reflected at the recoverable amount subject to a maximum of depreciated historical cost.

### 6. INVESTMENT :

Investments that are readily realisable and intended to be held for not more than a year are classified as a current investment. All other investments are classified as long-term investments. Current Investments are carried at lower of cost and fair value determined on an individual investment basis. Long term investments are carried at cost. However the provision for diminution in value is made to recognise a decline other than temporary in the value of long term investments.

### 7. INVENTORIES :

Closing stock is valued at cost and the Dean certifies the same.

### 8. RETIREMENT BENEFITS :

**Gratuity (Defined Benefit Plan):**

The hospital provides for gratuity, a defined benefit retirement plan ("the Gratuity Plan") covering eligible employees. In accordance with the Payment of Gratuities Act, 1972, The Gratuity Plan provides a lump sum payment to vested employees at retirement, death, incapacitation or termination of employment, of an amount based on the respective employee's salary and the tenure of employment. Liabilities with regard to the Gratuity Plan are determined by actuarial valuation as of the Balance Sheet date, based upon which, the Company contributes all the ascertained liabilities to the LIC Gratuity Fund.

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❑ **Provident Fund (Defined Contribution Plan) :**

The Contribution towards provident fund for employees is made to the regulatory authorities, where the Company has no further obligations. Such benefits are classified as Defined Contribution Schemes as the Company does not carry any further obligations, apart from the contributions made on a monthly basis.

❑ **Other Employee Benefits: Compensated Absences**

Accumulated compensated absences, which are expected to be availed or encashed within 12 months from the end of the year are treated as short term employee benefits. The obligation towards the same is measured at the expected cost of accumulating compensated absences as the additional amount expected to be paid as a result of the unused entitlement as at the year end.

Accumulated compensated absences, which are expected to be availed or encashed beyond 12 months from the end of the year are treated as other long term employee benefits. The Company's liability is actuarially determined (using the Projected Unit Credit method) at the end of each year. Actuarial losses/ gains are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss in the year in which they arise.

## 9. SEGMENT REPORTING :

❑ **Primary Business Segment :**

The hospital is primarily engaged in a single business segment of providing medical and health care services to its members and citizens and accordingly, this is only one reportable segment.

❑ **Geographical Segment :**

Secondary segmental reporting is based on the geographical location of customers. The geographical segment has been disclosed on the revenues from the main hospital and revenues from Vikhroli Unit.

## 10. PROVISIONS AND CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

❑ **Provisions :**

Provisions are recognised when there is a present obligation as a result of a past event, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and there is a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the present obligation at the Balance sheet date and are not discounted to its present value.

❑ **Contingent Liabilities :**

Contingent liabilities are disclosed when there is a possible obligation arising from past events, the existence of which will be confirmed only by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly within the control of the company or a present obligation that arises from past events where it is either not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle or a reliable estimate of the amount cannot be made.

## B. NOTES TO ACCOUNTS

### 1. Segment Reporting:

The primary reporting of the Hospital has been disclosed on the basis of business segment. The Hospital has only one business segment, which is engaged in providing medical and health care services to its members and citizens. Accordingly, the amounts appearing in these financial statements relate to this

primary segment. Further the hospital provides services in the main hospital at Dadar and its unit at Vikhroli, thus disclosures under secondary segment reporting are as follows:
